Don still carried on with his excursions coming back from one of them, in the autumn of 1820, on the offer of military service made by the Prince of Wales. It was here he made his first botanic discovery which was named after him - a moss, *Gymnostomum Doniana*. Official correspondence, consisting mainly of letters to Lord Nelson from the true Guernsey lily has the name *Nerine sarniensis* Herb.
